Elements of chartering: Worldscale. Maximising chartering revenue: Voyage estimate. Chartering and loading procedures. Post-fixture. Managing ships in the era of quality: Minimizing complications and claims related to cargoes and transport processes. New practices in the management of tonnage with special risks. Case study. Introduction to the future "digital shipping".
