(3) SYLLABUS

The course deals mostly with the law governing the rights and obligations of merchant seamen, including statutes, rules and case law. The main purpose of the course is to discuss the Status of the Captain and the Crew and the principal Conventions of I. L.O. Attention is also given to the disputes concerning the Conclusion and Termination of Employment Agreement, the Calculation and Payment of Wages as well as the Repatriation of Seamen. The course also includes a representation of leading maritime injury cases.
